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Well Deserved Recognition



We are delighted, and very proud, to announce that Dr Sabine Maguire, MRCPCh, FRCPI, FRCPCH, has been awarded an Honorary MBE, "For services to health and well being of children with disabilities in Wales." Dr Maguire was the driving force behind the creation of Serennu Children's Centre and the Sparkle charity and a key figure in the drive to create a unique state—of-the-art centre, for helping children with a range of complex disabilities.

Dr Maguire is chairperson of the Sparkle Appeal Charity – a charity passionate about the delivery of multi-disciplinary, integrated care of children aged 0-18 years of age who have a disability and/or developmental difficulty. Dr Maguire has spent over 20 years driving the development of Serennu Children's Centre as well as a model for integrated, holistic services to children and young people.

Dr Maguire has dedicated her life to improving outcomes for children and she is considered a world authority on child protection issues. In 2002 she became a Senior Lecturer in Child Health at Cardiff University. Her primary role was to set up and run a program of Systematic Reviews of Physical Child Abuse and Neglect program, this was the first such program worldwide, and involved the development of methodology for child maltreatment reviews. She has been involved in the production of numerous national guidelines/training in child protection in the UK, is a member of the editorial board of Child Abuse Review and mentors junior researchers nationally and internationally. Through her clinical and research work, Dr Maguire has improved the care given to children with complex needs and disabilities. Dr Maguire has also been at the forefront of international research in child abuse and has led the establishment of guidelines and formal training in child protection for paediatricians. Dr Maguire said "I was completely stunned. It would never have occurred to me that I would be considered for such an honour. It has been my privilege to have the opportunities I have had. I have worked with fantastic teams, both in Sparkle and in Cardiff University and beyond.

Any achievements I may have had have been team efforts, certainly not mine alone." Dr Maguire says she received the accolade "primarily in recognition of my voluntary work with the Sparkle Appeal, a charity I have been involved in as Chairman and trustee for over 20 years. We have built an award winning centre in South Wales, serving children aged 0-18 years with disability or developmental delay, and their families... In addition to co-locating health (outpatients and therapies), social services and the voluntary sector in one building.... We have led policy changes within our region, including parents being on the executive board, a fully integrated assessment pathway, care co-ordinators for complex cases, psychological support for parents, dads and siblings of a child with a disability or developmental delay and I also sit on Welsh Government working groups aimed at improving care for children and young people with disabilities.

Dr Maguire retired from Cardiff University in 2016, retaining an Honorary Contract as Senior Research Fellow, however her voluntary work with Sparkle continues.

From all the staff and families accessing Serennu Children's Centre, we would like to say a massive congratulations on the receipt of this wonderful accolade, which is very well deserved. Dr Maguire is truly amazing and inspiring and through her dedication, admirable and tireless work she has helped to improve the lives of so many vulnerable children around the world.
