A Well Deserved Recognition

We are delighted to share recent photographs of Dr Sabine Maguire MRCPCH, FRCPI, FRCPCH, receiving her MBE at her recent medal presentation ceremony. Dr Maguire was awarded her Honorary MBE back in 2020 "for services to health and wellbeing of children with disabilities in Wales". Dr Maguire was the driving force behind the creation of Serennu Children's Centre and our Sparkle charity, and continues to be a key figure in the drive to develop further facilities and services across Gwent that will support Children and young people with a range of complex disabilities.

Dr Maguire has dedicated her life to improving outcomes for children and she is considered a world authority on child protection issues. In 2002 she became a Senior Lecturer in Child Health at Cardiff University. Her primary role was to set up and run a program of Systematic Reviews of Physical Child Abuse and Neglect program, this was the first such program worldwide, and involved the development of methodology for child maltreatment reviews. Through her clinical and research work, Dr Maguire has improved the care given to children with complex needs and disabilities and she has been at the forefront of international research in child abuse and led the establishment of guidelines and formal training in child protection for paediatricians. Dr Maguire retired from Cardiff University in 2016, retaining an Honorary Contract as Senior Research Fellow, however, her voluntary work with Sparkle continues.







From all the staff and families accessing Serennu Children's Centre, Nevill Hall Children's Centre and Caerphilly Children's Centre, we would like to say a massive congratulations on the receipt of this wonderful accolade, which is very well deserved. Dr Maguire is a truly amazing and inspiring lady and through her dedication, admirable and tireless work she has helped to improve the lives of so many vulnerable children around the world.
