Communication boards are visual tools that use pictures or symbols to support anyone who may have difficulty speaking or understanding spoken language. They provide a simple, inclusive way for anyone—especially non-verbal individuals—to express their needs and interact with staff. By using a universal communication approach, these boards ensure that everyone has a voice.

# BACK IN ACTION! INDEPENDENT LIVING SKILLS

We're pleased to share that our Independent Living Skills sessions have recently been reintroduced for a few sessions, thanks to generous funding from the Newport Shared Prosperity Fund. These valuable sessions were paused last year as part of a difficult decision during our restructure, so we're especially excited to see them return.

Young people participated in a series of well-being sessions focused on promoting positive mental health, developing money-management skills, and learning practical cooking techniques. As part of the programme, they gained confidence in preparing meals, safely using an oven, and taking responsibility for cleaning up afterwards.

During half-term, the young people enjoyed a trip to Cardiff, where they independently purchased train tickets, navigated the journey themselves, and built valuable confidence in using public transport.

One of the most popular sessions centred around personal hygiene. During this interactive workshop, young people explored different hygiene routines, took part in a practical activity where they learned how to wash and blow-dry their hair, and received personal hygiene gift bags to encourage ongoing self-care.

Natalie Smith (a parent) said:

"We have a confident girl who believes in herself and has managed to change a very rigid routine as result. We know how hard that must have been for her."
